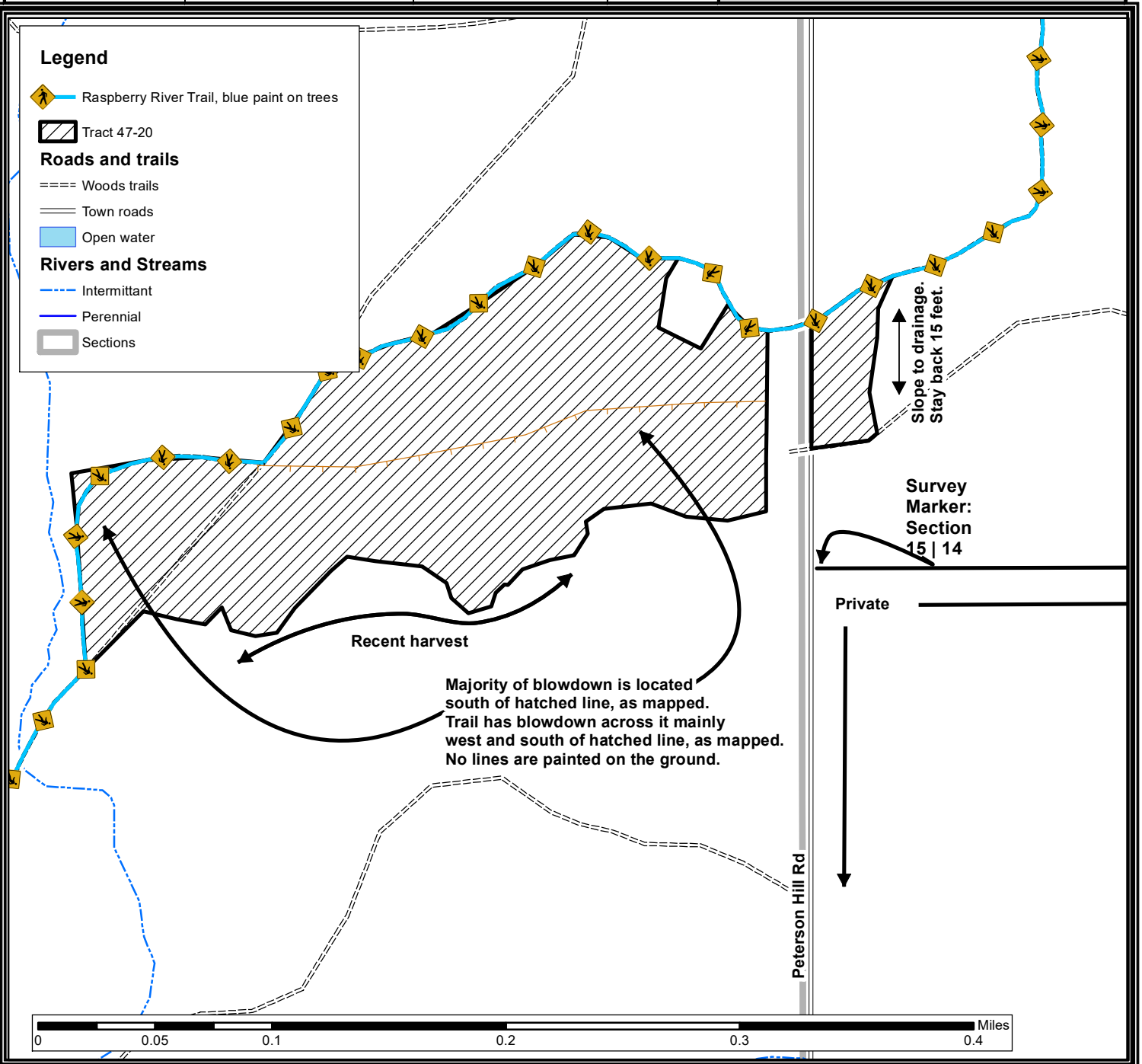

\*80% of oak to be salvaged is 12" to 24" diameter. 90% of trees are uprooted with no visible butt log damage. Approximately 10% of trees are broken at butt log or higher.

\*\*Basswood pulp includes approximately 75% basswood, 14% red maple, 11% ash.

## TRACT 47-20 – HARVEST REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Bayfield County Timber Sale Contract.

### A. PRESCRIPTION:

1. Harvest blown-down trees. This will result in a patch selection harvest in some areas, and a shelterwood harvest in other areas of this stand.

### B. HARVEST REQUIREMENTS

1. Harvest all blown-down trees. Harvested trees must be sufficiently root-sprung that the sale administrator will be able to tell from the stump that the tree had significant wind damage. The sale administrator may designate additional wind damaged trees that are broken off or have significant damage to the crown.
2. Leave all undamaged trees

### C. OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS and SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS:

1. Sale boundaries are the blue-painted Raspberry River Hiking Trail to the north; the slope to an intermittent drainage to the west; a recent oak seed tree harvest to the south; and Peterson Hill Road to the east.
2. A small pocket of blowdown is located east of Peterson Hill Road and north of the eastern stub access road, as mapped.
3. The majority of the blow-down is in the south half of the sale as mapped. Scattered trees may be encountered in the north half of the sale.
4. Do not leave slash within 15 feet of the Raspberry River Hiking Trail.
5. Do not use hiking trail as a skid trail.
6. Sale may be whole-tree harvested but not whole-tree skidded.
7. If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.

### D. ACCESS AND ROADS:

1. This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
2. Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.

### E. OTHER:

1. To comply with Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
2. Do not damage survey monumentation.
