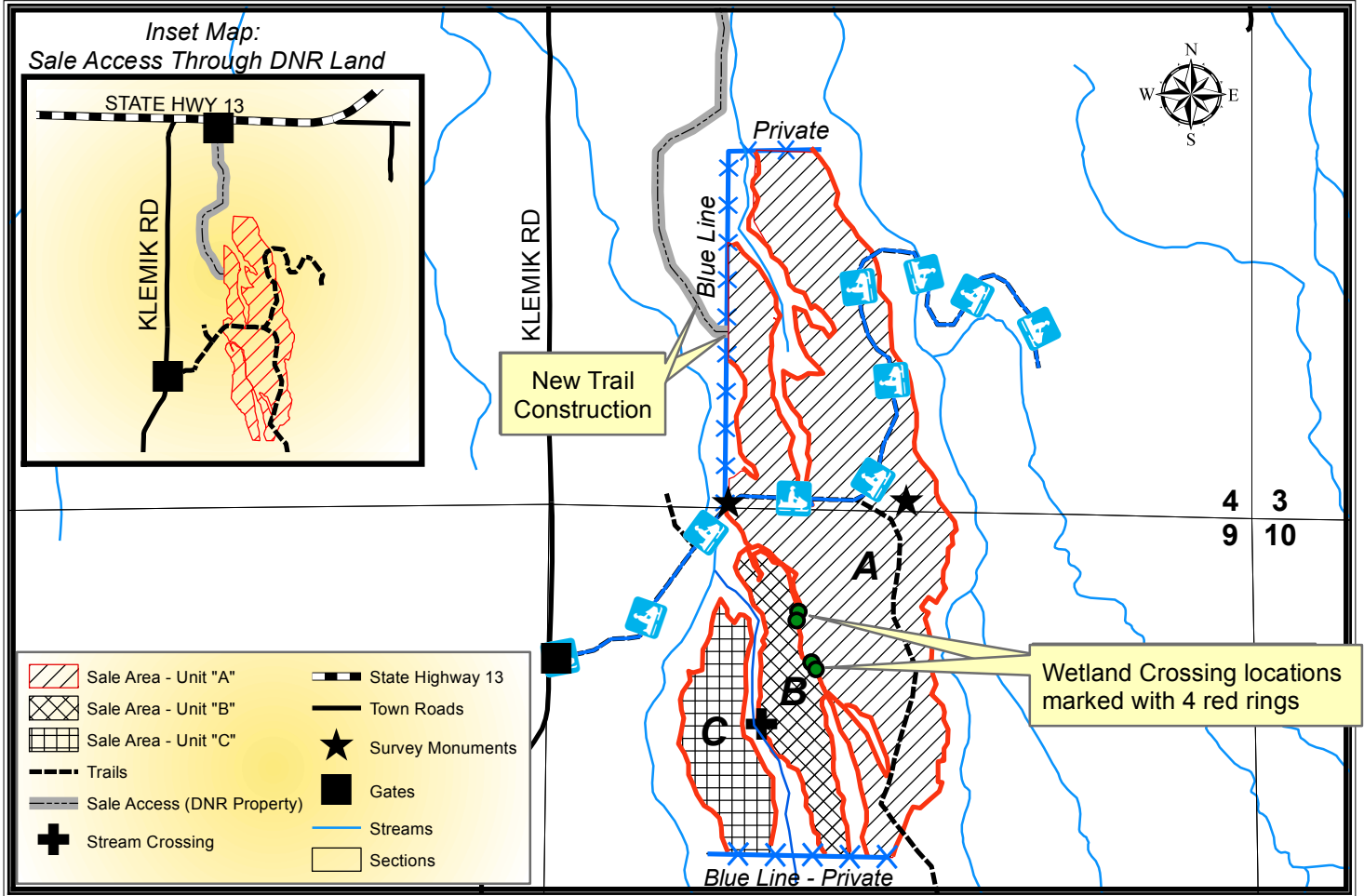

Harvest Requirements:

- This sale is being sold on a Ticket Scale Basis.
- Sale operation may only occur during frozen-ground conditions.
- Sale boundaries are defined with red paint lines or blue paint lines.
- No equipment or felled trees may cross the blue paint line (private) except where Bayfield County has secured access.
- NEW ROAD: Bayfield County has secured access through DNR property from Highway 13 through a gate on an existing trail. A short segment of trail will need to be constructed to connect the existing DNR trail to the sale. Purchaser will notify Sale Administrator before new road construction begins. All wood cut on DNR land must be kept separate.
- WETLAND CROSSINGS: Unit "A" and "B" are separated by red line except at 2 locations where the red line breaks and where crossing through wetlands is possible. The crossing locations are marked with trees painted with 4 red rings. Cross between trees painted with 4 red rings.
- STREAM CROSSING: Unit "C" can only be accessed via a stream crossing. Bayfield County has obtained 1 temporary bridge permit for the designated stream crossing location. Bayfield County will install the bridge once the purchaser completes road construction up to the bridge location. Purchaser will provide Sale Administrator adequate advanced notice of when Bayfield County should install the bridge at the predetermined location.
- If the whole tree harvested is utilized 1 in 10 tops less than or equal to 4" in diameter must be left scattered across the site.
- **Prescription In All Units:** LEAVE all purple-marked hardwoods. LEAVE all unmarked pine. LEAVE all cedar and hemlock. LEAVE all oak less than 4" in diameter. HARVEST all other merchantable hardwoods and sever all other non-merchantable hardwoods down to 2" in diameter. HARVEST all purple-marked pine. HARVEST all merchantable balsam fir and spruce.
- The snowmobile trail must be kept unobstructed and in a packed-snow condition. The purchaser must sign the trail and insure that harvesting and hauling operations will not create a safety hazard to snowmobilers.
- Harvested pine cannot be kept on the Bayfield County Forest for more than 3 weeks from May 1st to August 31st.
- Leave all snags except individuals that pose a safety hazard
- No decking of wood on state land.
- Do not damage any survey monuments.
- To comply with the Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off of the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces of the logging equipment.
- This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure. (refer to Sec. 17)
