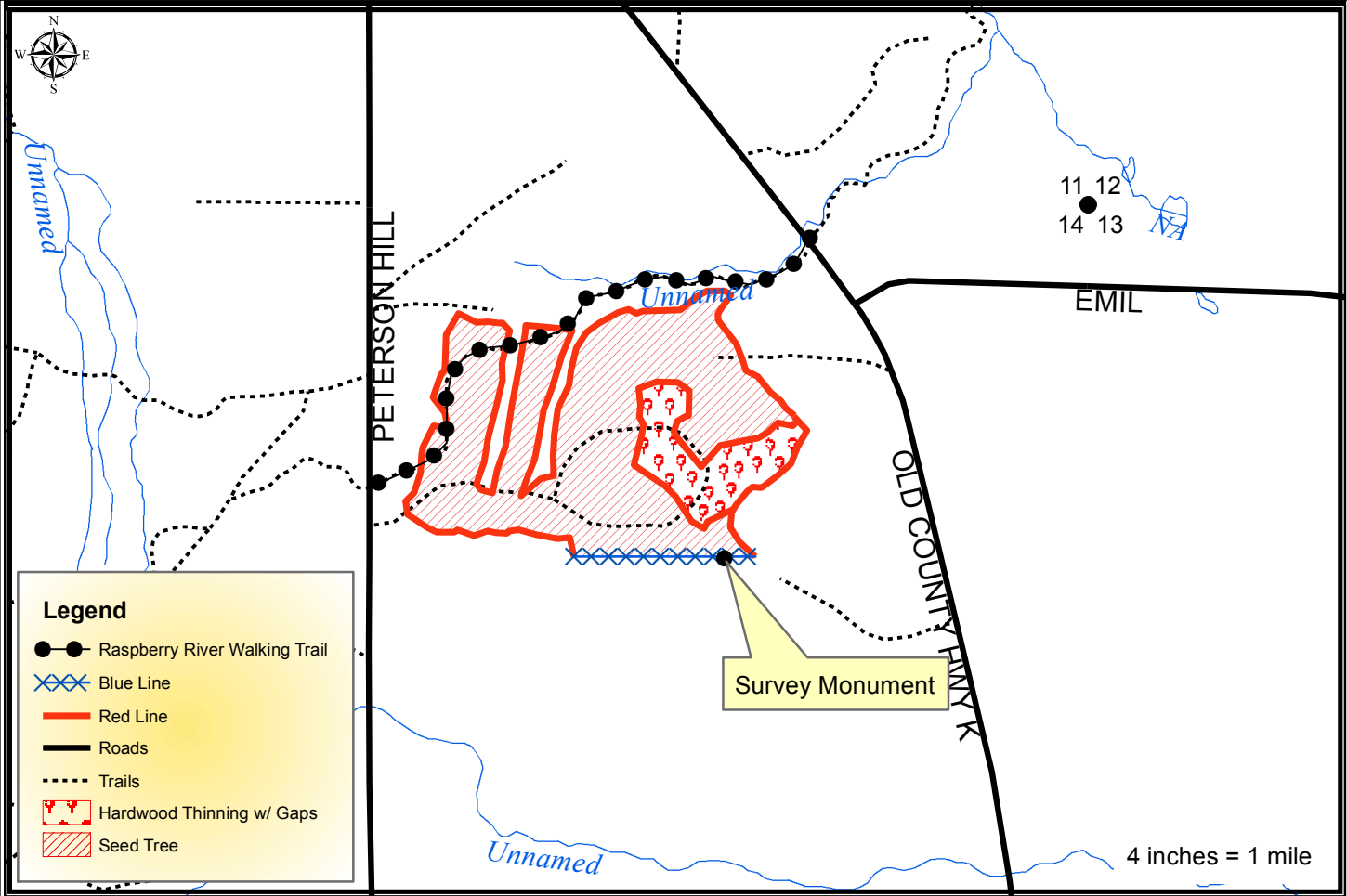

Harvest Requirements:

- Sale is a seed tree and hardwood thinning with gaps being sold on a Ticket Scale Basis.
- Sale operation may only occur when the ground is frozen unless written permission is granted by Bayfield County.
- Sale boundaries consist of red and blue paint lines.
- In all units, Do not harvest any oak or yellow birch 8 inches dbh and under.
- Seed tree unit: Harvest all merchantable hardwood stems except those marked with purple paint. Harvest all merchantable balsam fir and spruce, leave all other conifer.
- Seed tree unit: There are a few defined pockets of 20 year old aspen. Do not harvest these pockets. Work with the sale administrator to designate these areas.
- Hardwood thinning with gaps: Harvest all orange marked trees within this unit. Within purple painted canopy gaps (6-8 two dot purple painted trees on the perimeter facing in towards the gap) harvest all merchantable trees except hemlock. Do not sever any non-merchantable stems. Make an effort to protect regeneration. No sale operation between breakup and July 15th.
- Hardwood thinning with gap: Short wood logging or pole skidding will be allowed if the purchase can demonstrate that it can be done without causing damage to the residual stand.
- The Raspberry River Walking Trail runs through the northwestern portion of the seed tree unit. Do not cut blue marked trees along the trail. Minimize crossing of the trail and maintain a 25 foot slash set back along the trail. Leave the trail in good condition and free of debris.
- The blue paint line indicates private property, no equipment or trees may cross the blue line.
- Do not cut snags except for those that pose a safety hazard.
- To comply with the Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off of the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
- Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.
- If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
- This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
- Do not damage any survey monumentation.
