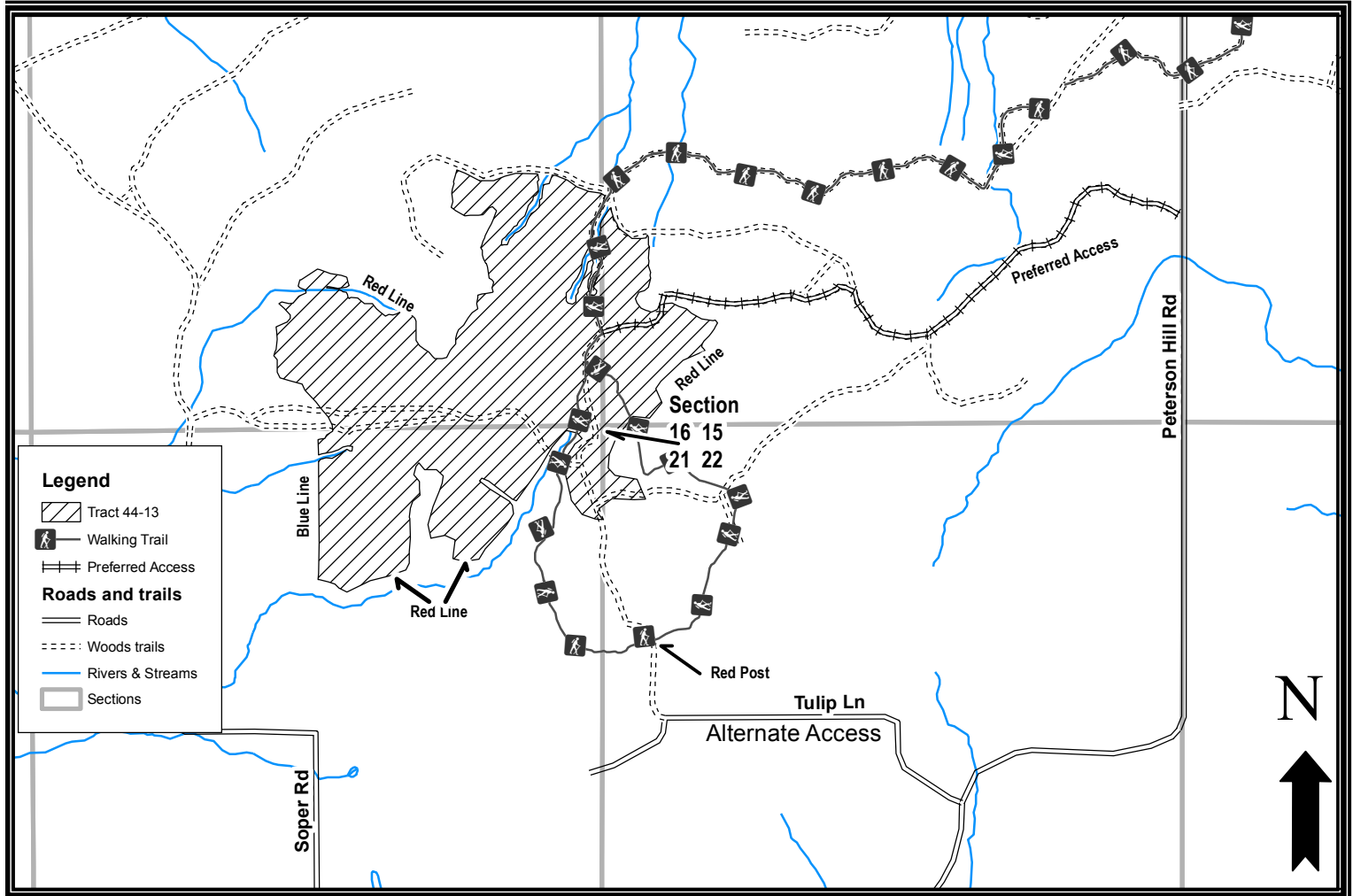

Harvest requirements:

- Sale is an overstory removal and a seed tree being sold on a Ticket Scale basis.
- Sale operation may only occur when the ground is dry, as determined by the County, or frozen. There are a few small clay areas near drainages that may require frozen ground conditions.
- Sale boundaries consist of red and blue paint lines, and the logging trail to the north.
- To avoid damage to regeneration, sale may be whole-tree harvested but not whole-tree skidded.
- If whole tree is to be utilized, leave one in ten tops scattered in the sale area.
- Minimize damage to saplings, except cut ironwood where practical.
- LEAVE all oak 8" in diameter and under. LEAVE all white birch and all yellow birch. LEAVE all purple-marked trees EXCEPT purple-painted basswood and purple-painted red maple, and LEAVE any conifer species.
- CUT all other merchantable hardwood stems except those marked with purple paint. Ignore purple paint on basswood and red maple: CUT all merchantable basswood and red maple.
- Do not cut snags except those that pose a safety hazard to logging operations.
- There are a few defined pockets of 20-yr old aspen. Do not harvest aspen less than 6" in diameter in these pockets. Work with the sale administrator to designate these areas.
- The Raspberry River walking trail runs through the eastern half of the sale. Do not cut blue marked trees along trail. Minimize crossing of the trail and maintain a 25ft slash setback along the trail. Leave the trail in good condition and free of debris.
- Do not damage any survey monumentation.
- Prior to moving equipment on to or off the sale area, scrape or brush debris and soil from exterior surfaces.
- **Preferred access** is east of the sale off Peterson Hill Rd. If southern route via Tulip Rd is used, some culverts or fords will need to be installed. If any drainage crossings are navigable streams, then the appropriate permit will be needed.
- All roads are in place but some road maintenance is required. This contract requires county authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
- Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission of Bayfield County.
