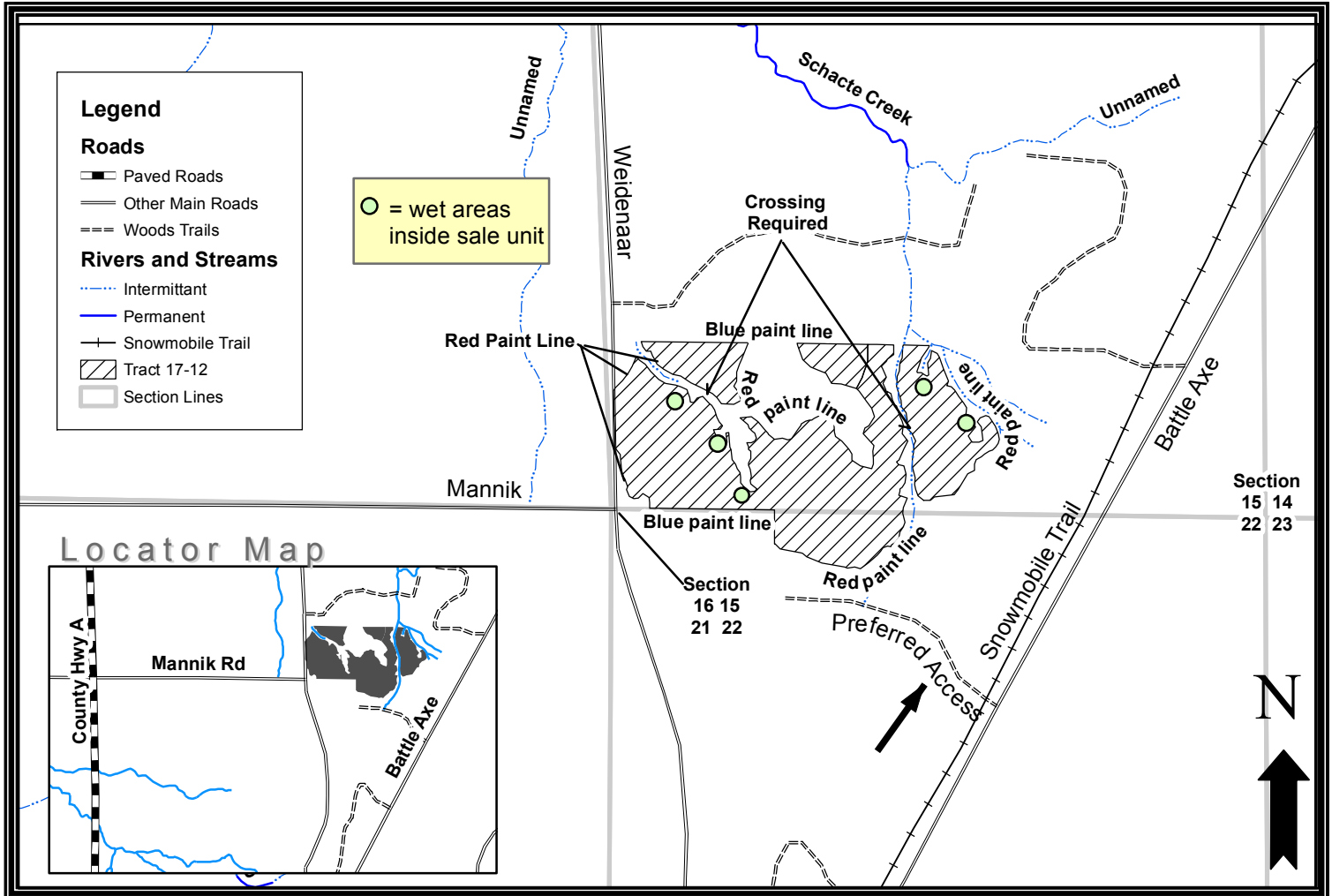

Harvest requirements:

- Sale is being sold on a ticket scale basis.
- Due to clay soils, scattered swales and seeps, and drainages, sale can be cut in FROZEN conditions only unless permission is granted by Bayfield County.
- Follow BMPs for water quality when crossing wet areas and drainage channels. Sale Administrator must approve all drainage crossings before construction.
- Sale boundaries are red paint lines and blue paint lines. Blue paint lines mark Federal property (north) and private property (southwest). Neither trees nor machinery may cross blue lines.
- If harvest will utilize the whole tree, one in ten tops must be left scattered in the stand.
- Leave all pine, hemlock, cedar, and oak. Cut all other trees 2" dbh and greater.
- Do not cut snags except those that pose a safety hazard to logging operations.
- Do not damage any survey or other property line monumentation.
- To comply with Best Management Practices for invasive species, prior to moving equipment on to or off the sale area, scrape or brush debris and soil from exterior surfaces.
- During winter harvesting the snowmobile trail must be kept unobstructed and in a packed snow condition. The purchaser must ensure that harvesting and hauling operations will not create a safety hazard to snowmobiles.
- All roads are in place, but skid trails are not. This contract requires county authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
- Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission of Bayfield County.
