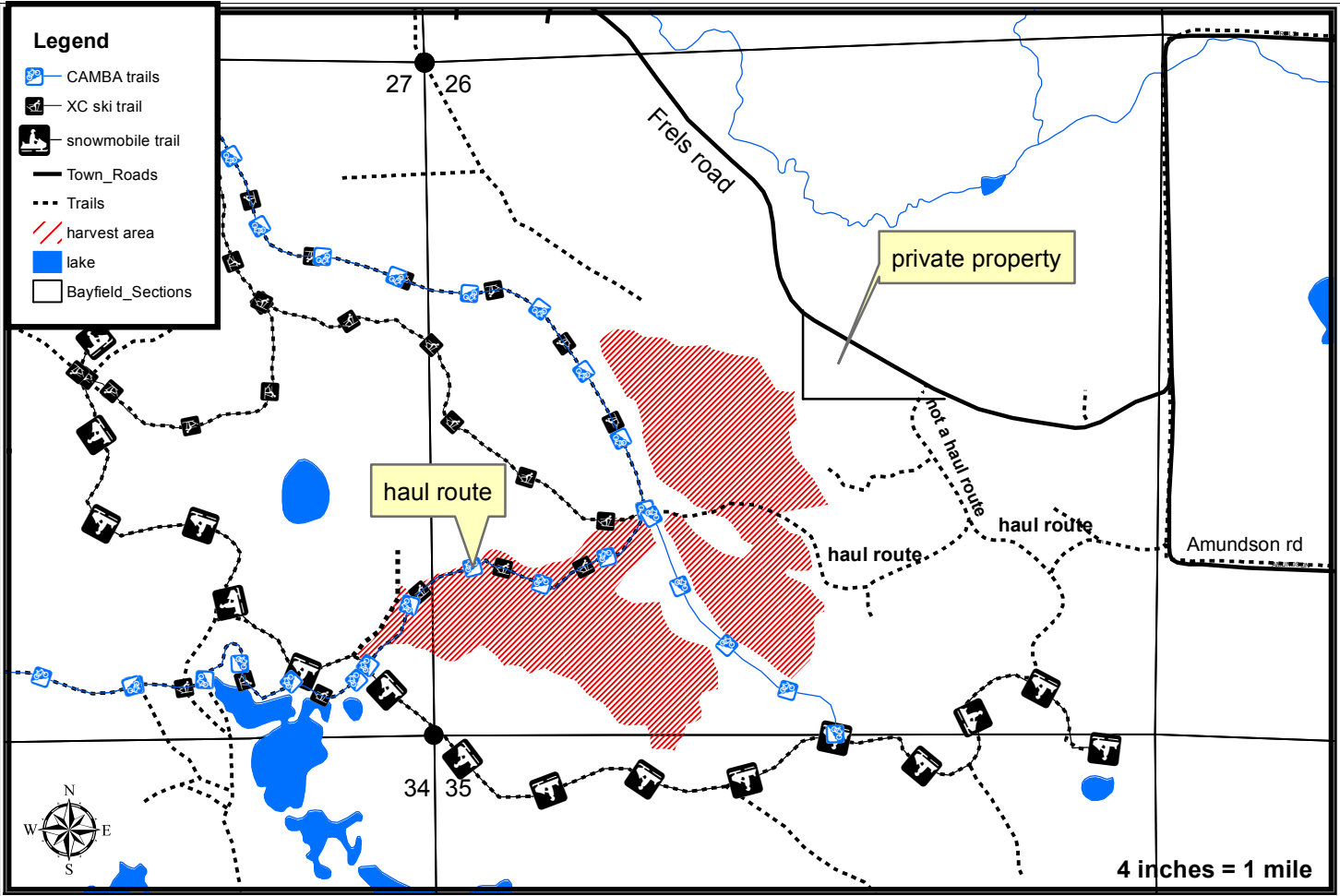

- Harvest Requirements:
- Sale will be sold on a Ticket Scale Basis
 - Sale boundaries are red paint or young aspen
 - A number of recreational trails are located in or near this timber sale. A portion of the ski/bike trail will be opened up as a haul route. Decking of wood must be minimized on this trail. A series of stub trails may be constructed for decking of wood. There needs to be a 25 ft setback of slash from all ski trails and bike trails. Upon completion of the sale, trails must be returned to good condition as determined by the sale administrator. No hauling will be allowed on the ski trail when there is more than 2" of snow on the ground. No harvesting will be allowed on the western unit of the sale when there is more than 2" of snow on the ground.
 - If the snowmobile trail will be utilized as part of the access for this sale during winter harvesting the snowmobile trail must be kept unobstructed and in a packed snow condition. The purchaser must insure that harvesting and hauling operations will not create a safety hazard to snowmobiles
 - Harvest all hardwood trees not painted in purple paint
 - Harvest all orange painted pine trees
 - Sever all non-merchantable hardwood stems 2" in diameter and greater
 - Leave all non-merchantable spruce, fir, and pine
 - Do not cut snags except for those that pose a safety hazard.
 - To comply with the Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off of the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
 - If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
 - This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
