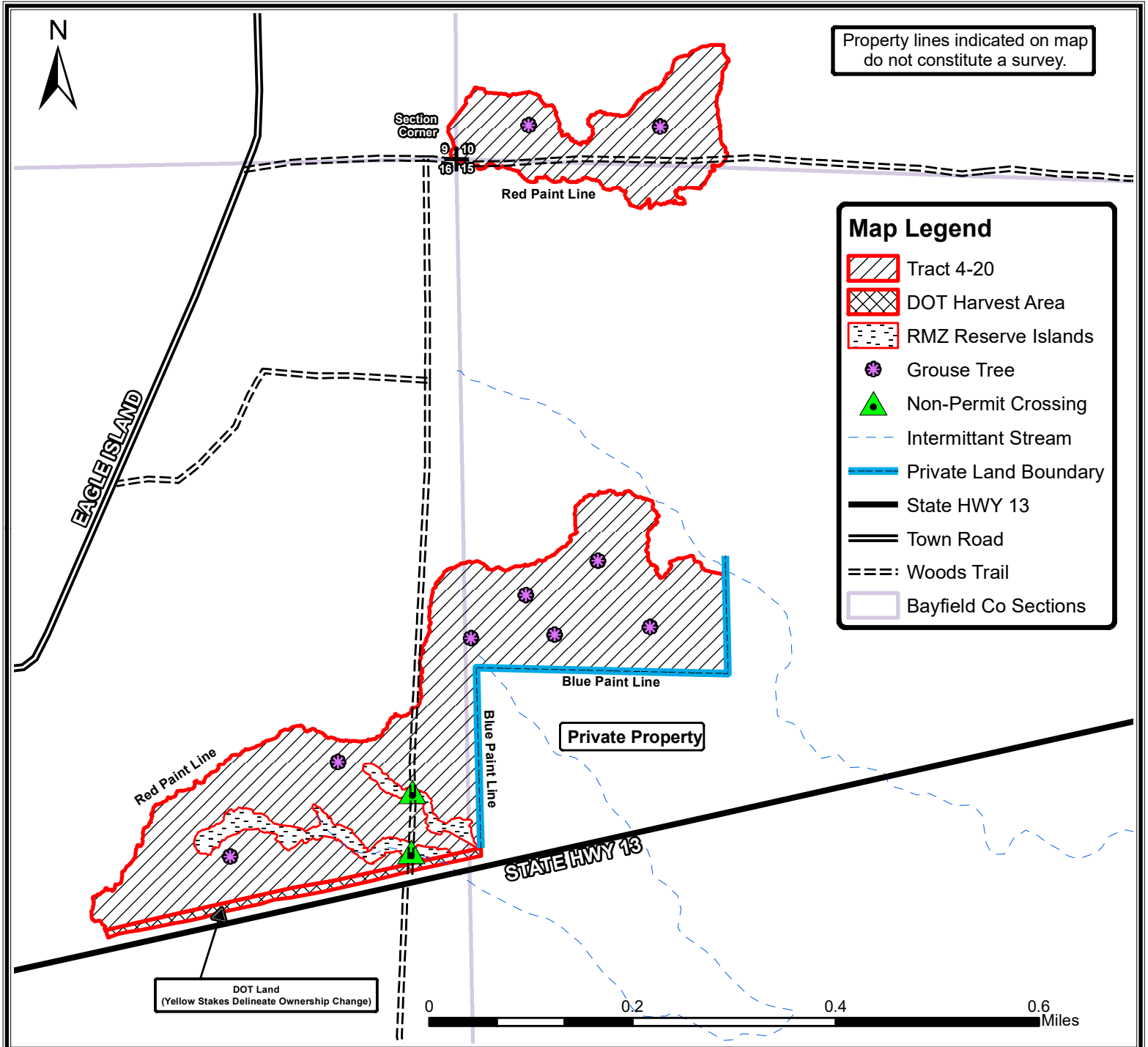

TRACT 12-20 – HARVEST REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Bayfield County Timber Sale Contract.

A. PRESCRIPTION:

1. Aspen coppice harvest. The designated harvest area contains a residual area of 10%. This percent of the total area includes RMZs and red oak.

B. HARVEST REQUIREMENTS

1. Cut all trees greater than 2" diameter, EXCEPT:
 - i. DO NOT HARVEST OR DAMAGE red oak.
 - ii. DO NOT HARVEST OR DAMAGE marked Riparian Management Zones.

C. OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS and SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS:

1. Harvest only during dry or frozen conditions, as determined by Bayfield County.
2. Non-navigable areas of concentrated flow along the haul roads will require protection to cross, as indicated on map.
3. Sale boundaries are red paint lines as indicated on map.
4. RMZ boundaries are red paint lines as indicated on map.
5. "Grouse" trees are marked with a purple "X." These trees must be cut 5 ft above ground and should be left in place lying on the ground next to the cut stump.
6. If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.

D. ACCESS AND ROADS:

1. This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places other requirements on road construction and closure.
2. Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.

E. OTHER:

1. A small portion of this timber sale along Hwy 13 is DOT property as noted on the map. All stems must be severed within this unit, EXCEPT do not harvest within marked Riparian Management Zone on east end of highway right of way.
2. Men working signs will be supplied to the contractor for work along Hwy 13 by the Bayfield County Hwy Dept. Do not damage any of the DOT yellow stakes and wooden posts marking the ownership boundary.
3. A permit is required to work within the DOT ROW. Permit must be filled out by the contractor prior to harvesting. There is no cost to this permit. Bayfield County will facilitate the handling of this permit. Contractor must provide the County 30 days advanced notice prior to moving into the job to allow for the completion of the permit.
4. Approximately 2 acres is located within the DOT right of way. This land is not part of the county forest and does not contain wood that is certified. An estimated 46 cords of non-certified wood are contained within this portion of the sale. The county will supply modified haul tickets for transporting the estimated volume of non-certified wood harvested from the DOT right of way.
5. To comply with Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
6. Do not damage survey monumentation. Any monumentation will be marked for avoidance by Bayfield County.
